The 911 Sign project proposal was defeated at the 2019 annual meeting. You need to understand that I was never against the concept of the signs. I along with others, felt that association funds should not be used for individual residences.

I was out of town for the April board meeting where they voted to spend money on the sign project from the Discretionary Fund - this was in direct violation, as this project had already been voted on at the annual meeting.

I did not comply; but I could not just walk away. I handed over a detailed list of Treasurer duties, the physical items & a thumb drive of AVA data – all ironically in the same briefcase I was given 20+ years ago. I also filed paperwork at the bank & resigned.

I was told several times what great efforts had been expended in developing this project - well NO ONE forced anyone to do it. Just like the 20+ years I spend performing the treasurer tasks. I did it because I liked doing it until now.

I feel bad for those who voted against using membership money for this project last year, as their votes were ignored by some of the board and I apologize to you, the membership, as I feel I have let you down, and am sorry for that.

I will email a copy of this to the secretary, but I will be surprised if it gets included in this year's meeting notes.

Lastly, I remind all, that if you are asked to vote on anything at this annual meeting, history has now shown your votes may not matter.
